Adult & Teen Challenge



Bill Malotte began struggling with addiction when he was 18 years old. After getting kicked out of school when he was 16, Bill went working in the tree service as a tree climber. It was here that he was introduced to methamphetamines at 18 and quickly became addicted. This started him on a long journey that God ultimately used to bring thousands of people his story of hope and redemption.

"I quickly became a closet junkie, so when I got married at 20 years old, I was able to hide it for 5 years. Eventually my ex-wife found out and she told me to either give up the drugs or give her and the kids up. I chose the drugs. By the time I turned 36, I had racked up 39 felony convictions and had spent 7 years behind bars. I really believed that I was going to be high for the rest of my life and that I had no other choice." In 2003, Bill turned 36 and was living in Salem, OR. The police had busted a meth lab he had set up at his house. Bill was at work during the bust, so he moved across town to another house and set up another meth lab that was also busted by the police weeks later. Again, Bill was not present during the bust. After moving out of town and moving back eventually, he called up a former employer of his and got a job back in the tree service.

"On my first day back to work in the tree service, I was dropped off at the worksite and met the guy I was going to be working with that day. As I was getting ready to climb up the tree, he stopped me and asked if it would be okay if he prayed before we began working. He prayed and started telling me how much Jesus loved me and He would meet me wherever I needed Him to. I thought he was totally crazy and couldn't wait to get away from him."

Two weeks later, Bill got in a highspeed chase with the Marion County Sheriff's Department. He was arrested in connection with the two previous meth labs found at his homes and for the meth lab that was currently in his car. He was taken to jail on 45 felonies, which included 3 class B felonies, adding up to a total possible sentence of 25 years in prison. He was given a court-appointed attorney who worked out a plea for a minimum of 16 years.

"When I got to jail, I told them I wasn't going to participate in anything and just slept for two weeks. I got a letter from that Bible-thumping fruit loop from the tree service and in the letter he told me that he was praying for me and that I needed to get up every morning and ask God to change me into the image of a son. I didn't know if any of it was truly real but I figured it wouldn't hurt to try."

Days later, Bill came out of his cell and sits down at a table with some of his fellow cell mates for a bible study. One of the inmates handed him a pamphlet for Adult & Teen Challenge. He knew immediately that God was speaking to his heart and told him that he was going to go to Adult & Teen Challenge. Bill thought this was impossible because he had the 16 year plea deal but he believed that if God spoke it, then it would be true.

"God continued to change me in jail, I even got baptized and started reading through the book of Job. I became the fruit loop, I was telling everyone about Jesus! I got a different attorney at one point and I told him that God wants me to go to Teen Challenge. He tried to bargain with the DA for me but the DA was not backing down from my plea agreement so my attorney told me to plea guilty and put it in the judges' hands." A month later, Bill pled guilty to his felonies and was going in for sentencing. After a long discussion with



the judge, Bill's attorney came back to him and told him that he doesn't understand how, but they were going to forego his sentence and let him go to Adult & Teen Challenge with the agreement that he needed to finish the program.

"I signed that agreement knowing 2 Corinthians 5:17. I wasn't worried, I knew I was brand-new in Christ. I attended the Portland campus for the next 3 months then transferred to the Spokane campus where I graduated in 2004. I did an internship and during that completed my schooling to become a licensed pastor in the Assemblies of God. I then worked for Teen Challenge for 6 years."

The program taught Bill how to me a Christian and how to walk out his faith that was new to him. He also learned character qualities and how to enact those in his own life. Proverbs 3:5-7 spoke to him while in the program and he learned wisdom and strength from God's word and fellowship with other believers.

"After I graduated, I met my wife Sherie. After working for Teen Challenge, I ended up going back into the tree service and became the head Chaplin for the Lewis County Jail. I really love going back to campuses across the PNW and sharing my testimony with students. I always tell them that God brought them out of this world for such a time as this."

Bill has moved to Grants Pass, OR and lives there with his wife. He currently owns and operates his own tree service and they are serving in their local church. $\cancel{-}$

Kimberly was able to take her children to their first ever baseball game.




Layne B. Spokane Campus - 2008

Jesse C. Willamette Valley Campus - 2008


Jesse now has found what he calls a "healthy addiction", and gets to enjoy God's creation in ways that were never possible before.


Emilee D. Eugene Campus - 2022
