

VANESSA'S STORY

Vanessa Plata led a successful life by society's standards before addiction unfortunately took over and made her unrecognizable to friends and family. Living and working in Eastern Washington, she was a personal banker for 12 years and was able to purchase her first house solo before she was 30 years old. Although she seemed successful and thriving on the outside, Vanessa was deeply struggling on the inside.

"It looked like I had all my ducks in a row but I was really struggling. In a past relationship, I was offered an oxycodone and was casually drinking on the weekends. It became something I did every weekend until it really got away from me and became a full-blown addiction. I began using during the week and before I knew it my body was completely dependent on it and would go through withdrawals if I didn't have it."

Vanessa was no-longer able to continue her normal life outside of using. She lost her job and was put on unemployment and when that wasn't enough to support her habit, she cashed out her retirement to fund her addiction. She was soon unable to pay her mortgage and was forced to sell her home and quickly used up those funds as well. Her addiction escalated from pills to fentanyl, then to heroin and meth.

"I eventually depleted every cent I had and became homeless. I was in and out of jail numerous times and every time I told myself this would be the last time but it wasn't, I was in too deep and had no idea how to begin to get out. The last time I ever got arrested was on my birthday in 2021 and I finally fell on my knees in my cell and cried to God and asked him to please help me."



Things began changing Vanessa before her eyes. Charges she had in numerous counties began to miraculously get dismissed and before she knew it she was on the last days of her sentence in Franklin County. Vanessa knew that she needed help and knew that she needed more than a 30 day program. Her mother got into contact with Kathy Rither, the director of the Tri-Cities Jail Outreach for Adult & Teen Challenge PacWest and together they made arrangements for Vanessa to

attend ATC in Graham, WA at the Women's Campus.

beginning of the program was really hard, I was constantly worried about my charges and if I was fulfilling everything I needed for my probation. It was a really big worry for me but I was learning how to give it to God and trust Him with my life. One day I got a call from my attorney and she told me that a new law had passed and she was going to be going before the judge to try to get the felony charge I was on probation for completely taken off my record. She called me a few days later and she told me that my record was clean of any felonies I had committed. I broke down; God was physically showing me that He can make me clean."

Vanessa continued with the program with a new pep in her step and was able to continue digging into why she began using and how to give that to God to heal. Tragically, Vanessa learned towards the end of her programthatherbrotherhadpassed away unexpectedly in a car accident. This rattled her and her family deeply.

"I felt like God had put me in this safe bubble so that I could work through everything I needed to work through without using. If you would have told me that I would be grieving my brother while sober back in 2021 I wouldn't believe you."

Once she graduated her program, Vanessa stayed on as a ministry intern in the Teen Challenge Ministry Institute (TCMI) program. TCMI is designed to help students who are interested in working for ATC one day learn the tools and acquire the skills they need to disciple people and help them further their recovery in the program.

"God used the TCMI internship to really soften my heart and once again provided me a safe place to learn and grieve. I was able to find a confidence in me that I hadn't realized I had lost when I lost my job. I was trusted and was proud of my work ethic and skills. I really enjoyed the modules because it gives you a whole new appreciation for what it takes to keep the campus operating on a day-to-day basis."

Vanessa got the unique opportunity to finish her internship in Portland, OR at the Shared Services Office serving as the Student Sponsorship Coordinator. Here she assists donors with signing up for the sponsorship program and facilitates sending out all of the sponsorship materials to student sponsors so they can be involved with their student's program.

"I am so grateful that God brought me to where I was so I could now be here. If I could tell myself anything in the back of that cop car as I was getting arrested for the last time I would tell myself to trust God because through Him it is possible. Just because you feel like you're at the end of yourself doesn't mean this is where He ends; this is your new beginning." **



TEEN CHALLENGE MINISTRY INSTITUTE

TCMI stands for Teen Challenge Ministry Institute and the mission statement is "equipping students today to become leaders tomorrow."

TCMI is a 12-month internship program designed for graduating ATC students who wish to pursue ministry and employment within the Adult and Teen Challenge PacWest organization or other ministry outposts. The program aims to equip student interns with ministry and leadership training, provide mentorship and accountability, and prepare them for employment, whether within the ministry or in other endeavors.



Here's a breakdown of the three main components of TCMI:

1. Ministry and Leadership Training:

This component consists of comprehensive training through 12 online courses, 7 hands-on modules, monthly virtual meetings, and 3 in-person intensives with leaders within ATC, and other guest speakers. The online courses cover various topics related to ministry and leadership and are conducted via Google Classroom. Hands-on modules include training in different facets of campus life (kitchen, fundraising, outreach, student services, etc). These are designed to help interns discover their skills and interests, serving as a foundation for further educational pursuits like Bible college.

2. Mentorship and Accountability:

Interns live onsite, typically at the campus where they completed their residential program. They receive regular mentorship from assigned staff, Life Renewal counselors, and volunteer mentors. This period aims to foster spiritual and emotional growth in a supportive environment, creating a space to develop leadership skills while remaining integrated into campus life. As interns progress through the program, they gain more responsibilities and privileges.




3. Eligibility for Employment:

The ultimate goal for many interns is to secure an entry-level position within PacWest Adult and Teen Challenge or related programs upon successful completion of the internship. The program prepares interns for their next steps, whether within or outside of the organization, focusing on solidifying their sobriety and relationship with God.

Overall, TCMI provides a structured pathway for interns to deepen their faith, develop leadership skills, and prepare for ministry or other opportunities, emphasizing personal and spiritual growth and servant leadership. Many students desire to stay and give back to the program that led them to Jesus, which ultimately changed their lives. It is not a decision made lightly and it is a privilege to walk alongside those who humbly make this choice. I am grateful to be a small part of their journey. Currently, we have 47 interns across the PacWest. Within the past year, we have witnessed 31 intern graduates! Out of these 31 interns, 23 were hired into our ministry's locations, and 8 continued their journey elsewhere.


